Nala Price | Green Dog



Her plays for adults include Forcing Hyacinths (Julie Harris Playwright Award, South Coast Repertory Theatre's California Playwright's Award); Fall Off Night (Garland Award, L.A.); Cliffhouse; Burning Bridget Cleary (Footlight Award, Best New Play, Seattle). She has received commissions from South Coast Repertory, ACT in Seattle, The Skirball-Kenis Foundation, Seattle Children's Theatre, and Childsplay, Inc. Along with her husband, playwright/director Steven Dietz, and her two children, she splits her time between Austin and Seattle.

Jessica Lynn Blackledge | Spot Light Operator


